Build and maintain a network of paved trails that connect Utahns of all ages and abilities to their destinations and communities throughout the state.



As recommended in Gov. Cox's budget, establish an Active Transportation Investment Fund (ATIF) by transferring 5% of total revenues deposited into the Transportation Investment Fund (approximately \$45 million in FY 24) into the ATIF annually. Along with a one-time General Fund investment of \$55 million, this initial \$100 million investment will accelerate the start of an on-going fund dedicated to building and maintaining the Utah Trail Network.

Managing trails as a program pairs the vision with a sustained budget and a dedicated team. This team would be responsible for oversight, management, and construction to ensure implementation of the Utah Trail Network. This trail network will elevate community connections and improve the health and wellbeing for all Utahns.



A dedicated trail network will provide critical connections and additional transportation options for however Utahns choose to travel. Safe and accessible trails will be a substantial contribution to the overall quality of life for Utahns and visitors for generations to come.
